



National Day of Reflection 23rd March, 2021

An initiative by Marie-Curie has encouraged Local Government to declare March 23rd as a National Day of Reflection, marking the one-year anniversary of the day a national stay-at-home lockdown was declared to control the spread of the coronavirus pandemic.
