Circumstance

Arthur joined the army on the outbreak of war, being a year under military age. He served in the Dardanelles campaign and was invalided home with a fever. Subsequently he was sent to France where he was killed by a shell splinter.

Notes

Two of Arthur's brothers, Charles and Albert, were also killed in WW1. Three more brothers returned home.

Their maternal grandfather was Charles Brewer, a farmer from Verwood
