

Circumstance

1911 Census shows Gunner Charles Dyer serving with 59 (siege) Coy., Royal Garrison Artillery, at Roorkee, India. At the beginning of the war he was sent back from India and engaged as a gunnery instructor. Going to France his soldiery qualities soon commanded the notice of the authorities, and he accepted a lieutenant's commission. Lieutenant Dyer was killed in action by a shell splinter

Parents lived on Three Cross Rd, West Moors

Notes

Two of Charles' brothers, Arthur and Albert, were also killed in WW1. Three more brothers returned home.

Their maternal grandfather was Charles Brewer, a farmer from Verwood.
