

Great turn out for the Free Tree Giveaway

The Free Tree initiative supports the Council's commitment towards reaching a carbonneutral Town by 2030. Additionally, it provides an opportunity to support the Queen's Green Canopy (QGC) project.

On Saturday 19th February, over 60 residents snapped up the chance for free saplings, which were given away between 10am and 12noon, by West Moors Town Council. Thank goodness for the generosity of West Moors Memorial Hall, as the shelter was much needed after 10:30am!

On offer were Blackthorn, Crab apple, Dog rose, Goat willow, Hawthorn and Rowan. The new copse behind the skatepark, where 105 saplings were planted by the local community back in January (donated by the Woodland Trust), will be the new home for the saplings that weren't adopted that day, along with an additional 200 recently purchased by the Council.
