2. Updates from last meeting

>National Dementia Action week (May) - Thanks were expressed for the many businesses who readily displayed a poster. We again were given a postbox topper and this has now been returned as per last year

>In Jolly Good Company explorations - Sarah, her colleague Annie and Lynne (Jo was unable to join us on this occasion) visited and had a guided tour of the facilities for the small hall at the WM Memorial Hall. Whilst the room was clean and well maintained with an excellent kitchen adjacent, concerns about access to the room for people in wheelchairs and also access to the accessible toilet (particularly in the winter months), means we are still looking for a suitable place to hold Jolly Days. A number of suggestions have been made. An approach to St Mary's has been made, but no response yet. The Guide Hall in Ashurst Rd, The Pavilion in Fryer Field, and outside WM - the Village Hall at 3Cross are all being looked into.

>Westival - Thanks to Barchester (Moors Manor) for a space on their table/stand. Some good conversations were had and though initially damp and with low numbers, it picked up early afternoon when the sun came out. The response to literature and wiggle worms was quite poor. Early consideration next year on what we would like to do - possibly something to do with memory aimed at everyone?! WESTIVAL is a Fun Day.

>Crocheted wiggle worms, made by St Mary's Knit&Natter have been handed to our social prescribers to help young and not so young people to ease anxiety and stress. Rachel expressed grateful thanks to the ladies of St Marys.

3. Living Well magazine : Deadline is today for the 7th edition. All items and photo's have been sent off. Advertising is improving and Lynne advised that we now also have a sponsor for a couple of years which is great news.

4. Fundraising : Jenna mentioned another event being organised by Moors Manor - the Big Bake Off and using 'Just Giving'. WM businesses would be approached to participate in purchasing a cake. More details later. Jenna suggested some form of advertising leaflets could go out with the cakes. Use the Generics or something geared specifically to the business community ? Any ideas?
