FITNESS ON FRYER FIELD

On Friday 6th January, a set of new outdoor Caloo gym equipment was installed at Fryer Field.

A 'free to use' fitness solution, this outdoor gym equipment can be found at an easy to access location, by the MUGA (Multi-Use Games Area), and is able to use 24/7.

You can hop into spring 2023, with a new fitness level- if you come and make the most of the fresh air and this free facility.

There are 5 different exercise units for a full body workout.

One rower, one set of exercise bars, one lateral pull and chest press combi, one leg press, and an arm bike and wheels.

This equipment has everything you need to stay fit and enjoy the workout outdoors!

On each piece of equipment, there are instructions for use and a QR code to download an app for workouts and guidance.

It can have long-lasting benefits to the community, including improvements in social cohesion, community health and a reduction in anti-social behaviour, loneliness and isolation.

We hope residents enjoy the equipment but must remind all to be sensible and 'exercise' caution when using it.

Bi-monthly litter picks of 2023

In January, sixteen of our trusted litter heroes came to our aid once more, removing over 20 bags of rubbish off the streets of West Moors. It was a shame to see that the New Year did not bring a new attitude for some.

For volunteers, there is a feel-good side of litter picking - not just the cleaning up - it connects you with nature and other people, increasing the activity levels and connecting them to others. One volunteer said: "when you're out there, you talk to people you would not get to see whilst rushing around in your daily life. You start to talk about the litter, but then you're having a good old natter".

Another added: "People thank you for doing what you do, and it makes you feel good about yourself, giving you purpose".

During the March litter pick, we saw fresh faces from new recruits, one bringing his dedicated children along, which was perfect, as it is their future we are trying to protect, as well as our present.

One of our volunteers hobbled on her rounds with a painful foot (we would have insisted on her giving apologies if we had known!), another climbed into a ditch to retrieve hidden rubbish (not recommended due to health and safety) and last but not least, one volunteer kindly spent extra time separating the recyclable items from landfill ones, helping the planet that little bit more.

The sincere dedication of our West Moors residents is undeniable.

Between them, 26 bags of rubbish were cleared. An unacceptable amount of cigarette butts were torn off the pavements. Cigarette butts are made of a type of plastic (plasticised cellulose acetate), and are not biodegradable, taking up to 14 years to break apart, their toxins seeping into the earth. They break apart into microplastics which stay in the environment for an unknown period of time. Fourteen years due to one second of selfishness. Before you flick, please think, and Bin Your Butts.

Apprentice or Vocational Grant

West Moors Town Council were delighted to award Jessica White, aged 16, with a grant of £250 under the Apprentice or Vocational Training Grant scheme, in January this year. The last time an award was received under this scheme was November 2021, so it was a pleasure to be able to help Jessica with the purchase of a camera to aid her photography course.

Dementia Action Group Grant 2022/23

A grant of £750 was awarded in March to help this Action group continue to be able to hold regular meetings, run dementia friends' sessions and seek ways of supporting people with dementia, and their carers. Home-Start Wessex Grant 2022/23

To assist with helping vulnerable and disadvantaged families with young children through challenging times, West Moors Town Council awarded a grant of £550. Covering a large area of Dorset, and across the borders of Hampshire and Wiltshire, in the last year, they helped a record 246 families.

WMTC hope this grant will increase that number and help reduce the number of difficulties the families face.

East Dorset (ED) and Purbeck Citizens Advice Grant 2022/23

Being an independent charity that provides free, confidential and impartial advice and support, WMTC awarded £800 towards helping everyone find a way forward, whatever their problem.

Their Mobile Advice Bus will soon be on the road visiting rural locations in the East Dorset and Purbeck area, reaching many more residents when help is needed at this difficult time.
