Community Speedwatch

West Moors Community Speedwatch is now well underway, having held 4 sessions so far. After a session is complete, the CSW data is uploaded onto the Dorset Police Community Watch system and speeding vehicles are checked for Tax and MOT. Any vehicle speeding gets a warning letter on the first occasion, on the second occasion a stronger letter and if monitored 3 times, it is likely that a Police Officer will visit the driver.

The next session is scheduled to take place on Tuesday 12th December.

Thank you to our volunteers for giving up their time and thank you in advance to our volunteers for all sessions in the future.

We currently have 8 volunteers, and the equipment is on loan from DP, which after 3 months the Council will purchase. It would be great to have more volunteers, so the less time that each one needs to give to the scheme and the more monitoring that can be done.

The Spinney Improvement Project

Starting in September this year, a local group of volunteers embarked on a mission to upgrade the community green space, The Spinney (located between Heatherdown Road and Southern Avenue). This refurbishment is now complete, after just two and a half months, as they have bought it to a standard that people can now enjoy and appreciate.

The Spinney Improvement Group have cleared paths, scrub and brambles, and more, to keep the space accessible, and the area lighter and more inviting to walk through.

They have also planted crocus and daffodil bulbs and wildflowers seeds.

Come the Spring, they hope to introduce the 'Bug Barracks', inviting the local Scouts and Guides groups to take part. Thank you to you all.

Jubilee Copse update

Having been planted in January 2022, the young trees in the Jubilee Copse, have fought through two winters, but in June 2023, the Council noticed that they were decaying and were surrounded by weeds. When planting large numbers of saplings, it isn't realistic to expect them all to survive. This is due to a number of variables.

However, those that held on, desperately needed tending to, so two community volunteer sessions were held this year (June and September) to carry out maintenance on these saplings. It proved to be very labour-intensive work though, and WMTC were determined not to abandon this project. So, thanks to the hard work of Evergreen Services, the Jubilee Copse has been transformed, and there are 170 saplings remaining, that we hope will flourish, encouraging the Jubilee Copse to become an asset to be valued and enjoyed.
