Circumstance

On 15th June 1941, Dunedin captured the German tanker Lothringen and gathered some highly classified Enigma cipher machines that she carried. Dunedin was still steaming in the Central Atlantic Ocean, just east of the St. Paul's Rocks, northeast of Recife, Brazil, when on 24 November 1941, at 1526 hours, two torpedoes from the German submarine U-124 sank her. Only four officers and 63 men survived out of Dunedin's crew of 486 officers and men.

Notes Harold was a medical practitioner in Dorchester in 1939 at Cornwall Road. Father, Theodore, born in India, was a retired medical practitioner living in West Moors in 1939, he also held the title Major in RAMC reserve. 17 Cornwall Road was the family home of his parents in 1921 and his father's practice address before retirement.
