

Re-Wilding of West Moors

Plans to sow wildflower seeds on grass verges in West Moors started in September 2021. Working in partnership with Dorset Council (DC), various locations in West Moors were earmarked for the planting of wildflowers to help attract wildlife to the grass verges and improve the overall environment. The seeds were purchased by West Moors Town Council, but Dorset Council Open Spaces Team carried out all the hard work, including measuring all the locations, marking them, weighing the seeds needed for each area, rotavating, raking and seed sowing. Councillors and Staff joined Daryl Pearce and James Walker-Beckett (DC Open Spaces) at Fryer Field to take part in the process for that particular location. Whilst working towards helping tackle Climate Change it has to be said - fun was had by all! West Moors Wildflower Locations.



During the week commencing 20th June, Dorset Council (DC) Open Spaces team, visited the wildflower locations within West Moors, and agreed that they were not at the point they hoped they would be. In some areas, although there are not swathes of flowers, they are growing – just very slowly. There has been communication between the seed supplier and DC, as it is not clear why they are not growing the way that was expected.

Soil samples have been sent to the supplier, as West Moors soil is guite sandy. and may be a reason to the seeds not taking, but this is to be investigated.

One idea that has been suggested, is to plant all prepared areas with bulbs in the autumn (daffodils, tulips etc) and to sow more wildflower seed at the same time, to ensure next year's display

With anything like this, it is an experiment, and there are many wildflowers species all depending on different factors, the growing rate of West Moors wildflowers has not been experienced by DC before, yet they are confident there is a solution which we will hopefully find soon.


