Goodbye to East Dorset District and Dorset County Council

On Thursday 28th March, West Moors Parish Council held their last council meeting before East Dorset District Council (EDDC) and Dorset County Council (DCC) ceased to exist. The new Dorset Council took over the functions of all Dorset's District Councils and its County Council on 1st April. The previous 206 Councillors were replaced with 82 and will run in 'shadow' form until such Councillors are elected on 2nd May. There will be 82 Councillors elected to represent 52 wards. Elections for all 163 Parish and Town Councils in the Dorset Council area will also be held on 2 May 2019. The deadline to submit nomination forms has now passed. Plastic Free Community

On Thursday 28th March at the Parish Council meeting, before a presentation by Janine Pulford (Editor of Mags4Dorset) on the plastic free campaign, Councillors were given a confident presentation showing an information board of why plastic is bad for our environment. It was singularly made by Kamto Ugwu, Year 4 pupil at Oakhurst Community First & Nursery School. Chairman of the Council Cllr Mike Hawkes invited Kamto to the meeting, after receiving his passionate letter asking for single-use plastics to be banned.

The board is currently on display in the parish office if anyone would like to see it. In addition there were 3 other students from Oakhurst Community First & Nursery School who gave an account of what they have learned so far about the impact of single-use plastic on our environment. Many of the students at Oakhurst have also written to local businesses regarding this campaign.

A poster drawn by a local girl called Lola Smith, Year 3 pupil at St. Mary's First School was also presented with the message "Do not drop your litter".

The Council have been very impressed with all the Children's efforts and hope that this generation will carry their excellent attitude onto the next generation and maybe there will be hope for our planet yet.

Support your local charity shops

In West Moors, Sue Ryder, Marie-Curie, Going for Bust and Prama are all looking for your support. Every year charity shops raise more than £110 million (data from annual Charity Finance surveys), funding causes such as medical research, overseas aid, hospice care, homeless shelters, environmental initiatives and animal welfare projects, among many others. Selling second hand goods prevents them going to landfill. All clothing that cannot be sold is recycled, for example, shops remove 250,000 tonnes of textiles from the waste stream each year (data from Charity Retail Association surveys and Charity Finance). Charity shops are a dependable source of low cost but good quality items for those that are less fortunate. New bought-in goods are often Fairtrade products while reusing goods prevents outsourced labour. Volunteers in stores can make new friends and learn new skills as they gain work experience.
