#### WESTIVAL- Saturday 13th July, 2019

For the second year running, West Moors Parish Council held a Community event on Fryer Field, which saw proceeds going to Amelia's Rainbow, a local Children's charity.

On Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> July, WESTIVAL attracted over 1,200 people with various activities, entertainment, refreshments, prizes and dry weather!

We often hear a lot about British values. The key British value is when people come together to help other people. There was an extensive amount of this on Saturday. Over 22 volunteers gave their time before, during and after the event. A last minute feature, the water zorbers, proved to be very popular.

The Surf simulator was brought in to replace the unfortunate cancellation of the climbing wall. However it was not well used so may not appear at future events. The Children's entertainer, Krazy Kev made the children smile once again so he is definitely going to be invited again!

There were bungee trampolines, fairground rides, a play centre, a super slide (all William Cole & Son), football skills (Grange FC), Pony Riding (4 Season Forest Rides), Ferret Racing (Purbeck Ferret Rescue) and an array of stalls. A fantastic raffle was drawn at the end of the day with lots of wonderful prizes being won. This year also saw cash prizes go to the winners of the adult and children's competitions. Mr Jim Brennan received £100 for his very humorous but complimentary poem called 'why I love West Moors' (see Page 4). With extreme generosity he has donated this £100 to Amelia's Rainbow. Miss Holly Carpenter won £50 for her logo for the Parish Council.

For the Classic Car enthusiasts, there were over 70 cars on display. Some were part of clubs, others just proud owners and residents of the village. They were all presented with a token of appreciation for their attendance.

Over at the Skate Park you would have found Team Rubicon involving the young ones in scooting and skate boarding tricks with demonstrations and lessons. Surveys were handed out asking the public for their thoughts on the future of the Skate Park. A further event will be taking place there on September 27<sup>th</sup> 6-8pm regarding this project.

Dorset Fire and Rescue Service gave their time and Fire Engine which was enjoyed by many children. As was the Police Vehicle that Dorset Police PCSO's brought along.

West Moors Parish Council would like to thank Brewer & Brewer and Phoenix Marble & Granite for sponsoring the publicity and music costs for the event! A grand total of £1534.15 was raised for Amelia's Rainbow. The Parish Council were also delighted to bring our wonderful community together at this event. ### Dolman's Farm, West Moors 'A Hidden Gem'

Dolman's Farm is on the Castleman Trail on the Ferndown side of the village and it was given to Wayfarers' Sports Club as a permanent way back in the 1960's.

Over the years it has been used for hockey, rugby and cricket. However, for the past fifteen years it has had two cricket squares and outfields side by side – an excellent local facility which is where the merged cricket clubs of West Moors, Ferndown and Wayfarers play their cricket, alongside Dorset Junior Cricket Teams, Dorset Schools and one or two others. Why not have a walk down the bridle path from West Moors of a weekend to see what's going on.

The Ferndown Wayfarers' Cricket Club has an extensive Youth coaching set up for 5-16 year old girls and boys and also boasts a ladies/girls soft ball cricket team. There are four adult teams which play in the Dorset & Hampshire Cricket Leagues every weekend and the six junior teams practice, train and play matches in local junior leagues or on a friendly basis.

There is a lovely modern clubhouse, changing rooms and bar and everything is run on a voluntary basis. The former East Dorset District Council recently recognised the importance of the club and its local facilities by allocating a significant improvement grant, much of which is being spent on car parking facilities, ladies changing room, etc. There are now three Boule Courts which are used my members each Thursday evening and Sunday morning from Easter through to the end of October. The emphasis here is recreational and fun.

This hidden gem is a West Moors facility and more villagers, young and old, and also local society and club members, are welcome down at Dolman's Farm enjoying the lovely surroundings. # West Moors Parish Council – Referral Agent for Ringwood Foodbank

Sadly, anyone can find themselves at crisis point for a number of different reasons.

If you are struggling to put food on the table, you can obtain a foodbank voucher from a Local Agency of the Foodbank (Doctors, Library, Citizens Advice, Children's centres etc)
West Moors Parish Council recently became a referral agent for Ringwood Foodbank.
They are now responsible for taking basic details from the client to complete the voucher.
This helps identify the cause of the crisis and offer practical guidance.

Once a client has been issued with a voucher, they can exchange this for a minimum of three days of emergency food at the nearest foodbank centre.
