West Moors Parish Council will be holding its Annual Public Meeting in the Pavilion, Fryer Field. Bond Avenue.

Steve Wallis, Senior Archaeologist at Dorset County Council, will start the meeting by giving an informative talk on the remains of fifty beheaded Vikings found during the construction of the Weymouth Relief Road. It will be followed by Reports from the Chairman of each committee:-

Finance and General Purpose, Planning Consultative, Environment and Staff and Personnel.

Introduction of Apprentice / Vocational Training Grant Award scheme applications now open for July 2016

West Moors Parish Council are pleased to announce the introduction of an Apprentice and Vocational grant scheme.

It is a scheme to support young people aged between 16 and 20 years to assist them with purchase of related tools and equipment essential to their training. **THE GRANT** of up to £250 can be awarded to a single individual as a lump sum after proof of cost incurred is provided. **THE APPLICANT** must be; A resident of West Moors for 12 months prior to the date of application and must be able to prove their acceptance and/or attendance on a recognised apprenticeship or vocational training scheme.

The successful applicant must agree that West Moors Parish Council can publicise the grant awarded, at any time in any form of media. Applications will be considered 3 times a year, no later than the 31st July', 30th September and 31st January each year.

Community Notice Exercise in West Moors on Tuesday 26 April 2016

Annual Revenue Grant to West Moors Youth Club:

West Moors Parish Council generously provided West Moors Youth and Community Club with a £3,300 cheque in March to support the running of their facility which helps to maintain all the wonderful support they offer the younger community.

Allotment Update

The Parish Council have been working with Sturts Community Trust to provide allotments for the village. We are pleased to announce that progress has been made and currently we are waiting for the installation of water to the site. The parish council is hopeful that within the next few months some allotments will be available at Gulliver's Farm. There is a waiting list but if you would like to add your name to the list please feel free to contact the parish office.

Budget: Council Tax Update

The Parish Council set its budget in January and decided on the amount of funding it required to maintain its services.

Due to Dorset County Council removing its funding from youth services the Parish Council has had to add additional funds to its budget to ensure that the West Moors Youth Club can continue to operate. The other main reason for the increase in your Parish Council's portion of council tax is the reduction in Council Tax Support grant from £4,149 to zero. This means that a Band D household will be paying £37.19 per year to the Parish Council, an increase of £2.98 from last year. WEST MOORS PARISH COUNCIL 'WORKING FOR THE PUBLIC GOOD'

Introduction to marriage allowance by HMRC

You could be entitled to £212 per year if you are married or in a civil partnership and one of you has an income below £10,600 (paying no tax), the other pays tax on an income lower than £42,385 and finally you were both born on 6 April 1935 or later.

You can claim online at gov.uk/marriage-allowance. Or call the income tax helpline on 0300 200 3300 which is open 8am-8pm Mon-Fri and 8am-4pm Saturdays. Alternatively, claim by letter to Pay As You Earn, HM Revenue and Customs, BX9 1AS.

You will need names, dates of births and National Insurance numbers.
Once you start receiving the benefit, you can continue claiming whilst your circumstances remain the same.
