## **West Moors Parish Council Annual Public Meeting**

The Annual Public Meeting was held on Thursday 20th April at St. Anthony's Church hall and was attended by many residents this year. Guest Speaker, the Police & Crime Commissioner for Dorset Mr Martyn Underhill started the evening off by giving an informative update on the PCC's role and the future of policing. He had a question and answer session and stayed for the rest of the meeting. The Parish Council then made its report to the residents, with the Chairman of each Committee (Finance and General Purpose, Planning Consultative, Environment and Staff and Personnel) explaining what it had been doing over the past year. They answered a variety of questions from the parishioners and their fellow Councillors. (Anyone may attend but only registered electors of the parish of West Moors may speak and vote) There were interesting points raised and discussed and some humour exchanged between the parishioners, the Council and Mr Underhill. This Annual Public Meeting is a legal requirement but was, we hope, enjoyed by all those present. The Parish Council has taken note of comments and requests that were made, and hope that the residents present felt that they had been able to discuss the village and what is important to them. # Tesco Bags of Help – Groundwork UK – 2016 award.

The Tesco's Bags of Help Initiative is provided by money from the five pence charge levied on single-use carrier bags. So far this initiative has awarded over £25 million to more than 3,000 local community projects. From 1<sup>st</sup> – 31<sup>st</sup> December 2016 Tesco customers in East Dorset were given the opportunity to choose the Fryer Field Play Area to receive their vote. ## **Apprentice Scheme 2016/17**

This Award is given annually to a resident of West Moors aged between 11 and 17 years who has demonstrated a particular talent in sport or physical activities or the Arts, such as music, drama, painting or literature. The recipient will receive up to £1,000 to help towards the cost of equipment, clothing, extra coaching or travel.

The award is made only once a year, with the closing date for applications being 24<sup>th</sup>
