REMEMBRANCE DAY PARADE

Together, everyone had an opportunity to reflect, to remember and to be reminded of the fragility of human life.

Update on the Yellow Buses new rest stop at The Petwyn

After a meeting with Mr Adrian Glover (Planning and Schedules Manager for Yellow Buses Dorset) on Tuesday 8th December 2015, at which Cllr P Yeo and Judi Weedon (Clerk) were both present, the mystery about the new waiting stop at The Petwyn was laid to rest. The 4c is permitted to wait at the War Memorial in the service road as it is a designated bus stop, in accordance with the NAPTAN (National passenger transport access node). It is an official and at times, an essential turning point for the 4c, which has various problems commuting through West Moors, yet continues to do so. Please support The Yellow Bus Company so we may retain the service through our village and allow the many residents to keep their independence.

Defibrillator Training Sessions

Two Defibrillator (AED)/ Cardiac Arrest Response Seminars have been carried out since the installation of the new AED unit outside the Co-Operative, Station Road. Both of them were organised by the parish council.

The first session was provided by Community Heartbeat (CHT) in West Moors Memorial Hall on Wednesday 4th November, 2015.

A total of 54 people (which included local and nearby residents, parish councillors and members of Wimborne and Ferndown Lions Club) attended this free training session.

The second training session was provided by four members of the SWAS (**S**outh **W**est **A**mbulance **S**ervice **T**rust); Russell James, Carolyn Wills, John Jeyes and Maria McCabe, at The Pavilion.

This saw fewer attendees but was just as beneficial.

West Moors Parish Council thanks Community Heartbeat and SWAS for providing such essential training, a huge thanks to Wimborne and Ferndown Lions Club for their very generous donation of the defibrillator and to The Co-Operative for hosting the unit.

Saving West Moors Youth Club

On October 29th 2015 at the full WMPC meeting, a presentation was given by the Youth Worker from WMYC (West Moors Youth Club), Mo Shearing (who presented on behalf of a young member of the club Codie Cowan) and another young representative, Stasia Smith (aged 12), regarding the consequences should WMYC have to close along with the advantages of keeping it open. Arguments presented included; the running costs would still be required to maintain a building that is not used, not having a safe and trustworthy environment for young people if closed with the possible increase in anti-social behaviour and the fact that staff provide a welcoming place to spend time and offer support.

The Parish Councillors commended Ms Smith for her very well written and presented arguments and said how proud they were of all the young people to articulate their views on such an emotive topic. Cllr Lovegrove stated that the parish council would do everything in its power to ensure that the youth club would not be adversely affected by the savings that DCC has to make to youth services.

Grant to Girl Guiding West Moors

Mrs Jane Songhurst, the Girl Guiding District Commissioner for West Moors, came into the office on Monday 23rd November 2015 to personally receive the cheque for £700 for the Girl Guiding West Moors district. This was enthusiastically presented to her by Cllr P Yeo (Chairman). This will help fund the installation of the new loft insulation at the Guide Hall. The purpose of Girl Guiding is to promote opportunities for girls and young women to make new friends, enjoy new activities and work together as a unit.

At the hall on Ashurst Road they can now do this in extra comfort and maximize their energy efficiency at the same time.
