# 20mph Survey

Thank you to everyone who completed our survey on reducing the speed limit on Station Road and adjoining roads to 20mph. 61% of respondents stated they did not want the Council to spend public money on a town-wide consultation on this issue.

In light of the results, a majority of the Council voted not to pursue a 20mph limit for Station Road. However, they will look into further measures at the St Mary's school junction alongside the expected pedestrian crossing to improve safety in this area.

#### News from Dorset Council

- Residents have been experimenting with a new online simulator to discover the complex and difficult decisions councillors must make when setting the budget. The simulator allows you to set the council tax rate and adjust spending across key services to see the impact of your choices. Paper copies are available in all Dorset Libraries.
- Age Friendly Dorset want to survey adults aged over 50 across the county, to better understand what life is like for older people in the community and identify areas that need improvement. Paper copies are available in the West Moors Town Council Office.
- Dorset Council's Green Space Team are working on a habitat restoration project across five Sites of Special Scientific Interest (SSSIs) in East Dorset this autumn, (Stephens Castle & Dewlands Common North in Verwood, Slop Bog & Parley Commonin Ferndown and Pine Clump in Upton.The aim is to safeguard some of the world's rarest wildlife habitats while reducing the risk of wildfires. Work is expected to be completed by the end of December.
