We look forward to welcoming you!



5 Year Strategic Plan

As many of you will be aware, we've been working on a strategic plan with the aim of setting clear objectives to help improve West Moors over the next 5 years. We've released 5 questionnaires to collect your input on Highways, Environment & Community, Planning & Development, Town Services & Amenities and Promotion of West Moors. We must extend a huge thank you to all residents who have taken the time to complete the surveys and share their thoughts on each topic. Your views really will help to impact decision making in all these areas.

There is still time to share your thoughts on the Promotion of West Moors - this is our last questionnaire and it looks at how we can promote the town as a vibrant place to live and work. Alternatively, pop into the office for a hard copy.

We'll be compiling all the data we've received and will present a summary report at the Annual Town Meeting in April.



Community Grants

Grants awarded this quarter:

- Mosaic A grant of £1,400 to help support bereaved children and young people in West Moors with counselling sessions.
- Citizens Advice in East Dorset and Purbeck - A grant of £1,500 to help with providing free advice to residents.
- Home-Start Wessex A grant of £1,880 to assist and support families in West Moors.




Westival 2025

Precept 25/26

We understand that many families are facing financial challenges right now, and at West Moors Town Council, we're committed to providing the services our community relies on while ensuring we get the best value for money.

Like many others, we're also experiencing rising costs, including higher employer National Insurance contributions.

To continue delivering essential services, we've had to make the difficult decision to increase the annual council tax precept. This means that for a Band D property, the cost will be £71.03 per year, equivalent to just £1.36 per week towards West Moors Town Council.

Even with this increase, West Moors still has one of the lowest Band D council tax charges by a Town or Parish Council in Dorset. We remain committed to keeping costs fair and sensible for our residents while maintaining the quality of our services. Thank you for your understanding and support.
